TRIO SOLISTI, 8 p.m. Saturday, October 9, Whitaker Center, sponsored by Lois Lehrman Grass, honoring the memory of Dr. Robert E. Dye. This outstanding ensemble returns to Harrisburg to play the great Dvorak Trio in F minor and music by Rachmaninoff, Bernstein, Moravec and Piazzola.

DOLCE SUONO TRIO, 4 p.m. Sunday, November 21, Rose Lehrman Arts Center, sponsored by the Jewish Federation of Harrisburg. Based in Philadelphia, Dolce Suono Trio consists of flute, cello and piano. In addition to Haydn, Weber and Gaubert, they will play two works recently commissioned by the ensemble. *

CHING-YUN HU, 8 p.m. Saturday, January 22 at Whitaker Center. Winner of the 2009 Concert Artists Guild international competition, this pianist's Harrisburg recital takes place immediately before her Carnegie Hall debut.

ST. LAWRENCE QUARTET, 8 p.m., Thursday, February 10 at Temple Ohev Sholom. Returning for a second time on the series, they will play Mozart, Mendelssohn and the John Adams String Quartet, recently composed for them.

BACH CHOIR OF BETHLEHEM, 8 p.m., Saturday, March 19, Market Square Church, sponsored by M & T Bank. An extraordinary program of Bach, Britten, Bernstein and Stephen Paulus with an instrumental ensemble and four vocal soloists brings sublime sounds and spectacle to downtown Harrisburg. *
